Music Curriculum Statement
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Our music curriculum encourages a love, enjoyment and passion for music of all types and genres. We aim to provide <u>all</u> of our pupils with a musical instrument to learn and play, that will develop and provide a variety across the musical orchestra (percussion, woodwind and strings) as they progress through the year groups. Children will have opportunities to listen and appraise good quality recordings of music and performances, and experience real live music performed by professionals. They will develop their musical skills: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Listen and appraise- expressing an opinion, comparing music, describing what they hear. - Music and Musicians - using musical vocabulary, learning about famous composers and musicians and linking to musical history timeline and music from around the world. - Create - by responding and moving to music, creating their own musical compositions and improvisation, using musical technology. - Notate - record ideas in symbols, mark making and progress on to writing and reading musical notation, - Play and perform - learning how to look after, hold and play their instruments correctly, learning how to sing together in unison and in harmonies, to play in front of other people as a group or individually. Our music curriculum is cross-curricular where possible, to enhance and develop all areas of learning. Music curriculum will be enhanced by daily singing in assemblies with one singing assembly a week lead by the music subject leader, singing half termly in church and performing with their class assembly and performances (Harvest year 3, Nativity EYFS/KS1, Easter year 4 and summer UKS2). Extra-curricular musical opportunities including school choir (and playing in the school orchestra) and performing in our circle school music choir festival annually and any other opportunities that arise during the school year we are invited to take part in.
