RE Curriculum Statement
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our RE curriculum gives children the opportunity to investigate all major world faiths during their time in our school. • Each year children will cover 3 topics on Christianity, building on their understanding and knowledge from one year to the next. Many of our Christianity topics are taken from Understanding Christianity – these are marked with a reference number within the plan e.g.: (UC 1.2) • Two topics each year will be based on another world faith. In KS1 this will be Judaism. In KS2 all classes will study the same world faith, covering Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam and Sikhism over a four-year cycle. • One topic each year will be the same for the whole school, on a theme which can be traced through different world faiths, promoting opportunities for children to recognise similarities and differences. • Our learning approach is enquiry based, encouraging children to question and reflect upon matters of faith and belief.
