## Upskirting and Sexual Violence

Upskirting typically involves taking a picture under a person's clothing without them knowing, with the intention of viewing their genitals or buttocks to obtain sexual gratification, or cause the victim humiliation, distress or alarm.

Upskirting is a criminal offence.

Our response to a report of sexual violence or sexual harassment It is essential that all victims are reassured that they are being taken seriously and that they will be supported and kept safe.

A victim will never be given the impression that they are creating a problem by reporting sexual violence or sexual harassment. Nor will a victim ever be made to feel ashamed for making a report.
