### General Information

- Between 8:35am and 9:00am, children will be settling into class with early morning work. In Year 6, this often includes SATs practice, so arriving on time really helps them get the best start to their day.
- For safety, the classroom's outside door will be closed and locked at 8:45am (registration time). If you arrive after this, please come to the school office via the front entrance with your child to sign them in.
- We're always happy to chat at the door in the morning if you need us. For longer conversations, it's usually easier at the end of the school day, when we have a little more time. You can also use the Dojo app to arrange a time that works best.
- Unless it's urgent, we kindly ask that dentist and doctor appointments are arranged outside of school hours wherever possible.
- To keep all children safe, we are a nut-free school.
- Please ensure your child brings a named water bottle to school each day, filled with fresh water only (no juice or squash).
- To help us return any lost items quickly, please make sure that all clothing and belongings are clearly named.
- If your child has permission to walk home on their own, please complete the permission form available from the school office.
- Celebration assemblies continue to be on Fridays with parents and guardians welcome to attend. If your child is receiving an award, you will be notified Thursday afternoon via Dojo.

### NOTE


